- She can see the children.
- She is taking care of the children.
- She is looking at the boys and girls.
- The kids are in front of her.

They only have one TV-set for the family.

- They only like videos.
- They do not like any other things.
- They do not have two TV-sets.
- They have digital TV in every room.

What does Monica like?

- What are her favourite things?
- How is she?
- Does she look like Monica?
- Is he in love with Monica?

I want you to clean the kitchen when you come back.

- You want to clean it.
- We will clean it together.
- I don't want you to forget to clean it.
- I want to clean the kitchen.

Gary used to smoke cigarettes.

- He is used to cigarettes.
- He smoked before, but he doesn't now.
- He usually smokes cigarettes.
- He hated to smoke cigarettes.

Shall I take you to the station?

- Would you like me to take you to the station?
- I must not take you to the station.
- Will it be necessary to take you there?
- Did I take you before?

You should talk more slowly.

- You talk too quickly.
- I think you would like to talk more slowly.
- I understand you very well.
- We talk faster.

We can hardly see it.

- We always see very hard.
- We are on the hard side.
- We cannot see it very well.
- It is hard to see us.

Robin had his motor-cycle painted white yesterday.

- He had to paint his motor-cycle white yesterday.
- His motor-cycle is not white.
- They painted his motor-cycle white for him yesterday.
- He painted his motor-cycle yesterday.
