- They are probably the most intelligent of the animals without backbones that live in the sea. They catch their prey using their eight arms.
- ...**SHIPS**..... For thousands of years, they have been used to carry people and cargoes on rivers and across oceans. They still carry cargo, but today most people travel long distances by air.
- Years, day, hours, minutes and seconds – it can be measured in many ways. Clocks and watches help to measure it.
- They were Vikings from Scandinavia, who came to northern France in search of land and wealth. The king of France gave them land. They settled in Normandy. Later, in 1066 they invaded England.
- It's the world's richest and most powerful country. Products from there sell around the world, from chewing gum to computers.
- They are very simple living creatures. They are very small. They are found everywhere on Earth. Many live inside plants and animals.
- It is the cheapest and most important metal on Earth. It is used to make all kinds of things, from needles and screws to ships and buildings.
- It is a form of energy. It usually comes from hot objects, like the sun or flames, but it can also be made in other ways.
- It is one of the largest and flattest countries on Earth. Many of the plants and animals (kangaroos, koalas, wallabies etc) that live there are found wild nowhere else on Earth.
- It's the art of taking pictures with a camera, from deciding on a subject to developing and printing out.
- For thousand of years people have used them for work, for war and for sport. They feed on plants, such as grasses. In the wild, they used to live in herds.
- For athletes, swimmers, gymnasts and many other sports people, winning a gold medal at this event is the ultimate dream. More than 200 countries take part.
- It is the smallest continent, yet it is the most crowded. It has a huge variety of landscapes for such a small continent.
- For centuries it was a divided and fairly unimportant island. Then, after three kingdoms united, it enjoyed about 250 years of great power. After the Second World War it's power faded.
- It's an international organization whose purpose is to maintain peace all over the world. It also tries to help solve economic and social problems.
- They are sea-going vessels that can dive below the waves or travel on the surface.
